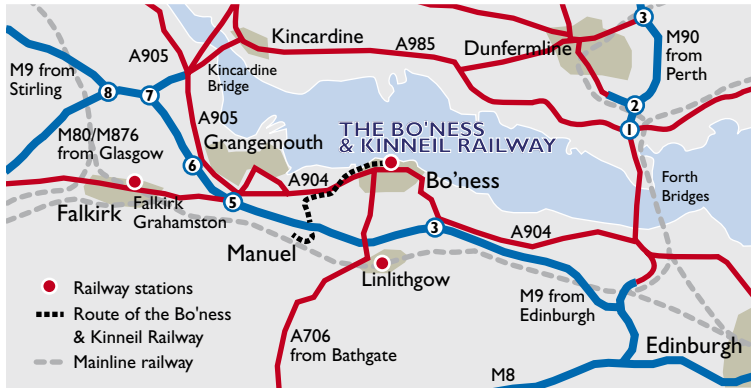

BO'NESS

Start your journey at Bo'ness station. Here you will find the Ticket Office, Station Coffee Shop, Gift Shop, toilets and free parking. There are also picnic areas, footbridge viewing area & Model Railway*. Be sure to visit the Scottish Railway Exhibition, Scotland's largest museum dedicated to railways. Two large halls of historic locomotives, carriages and wagons as well as a railway themed activity area for children.

Eating and Shopping

Our popular and comfortable Station Coffee Shop serves a full range of meals, snacks, hot and cold drinks and ice creams.

Visit our Gift Shop for railway books and DVDs as well as souvenirs, toys and gifts to suit everyone.



Good access for wheelchairs and pushchairs to Bo'ness Station platform and facilities. Specially adapted carriage for wheelchair users. Access to the Scottish Railway Exhibition can be arranged in advance for wheelchair users and others with mobility problems.
